### Methodist Studies Seminar Online on Friday 14 May 2021

This seminar will be hosted by Cliff College and the MWRC on **Friday 14 May 2021** from 10:00am to 4:30pm UK time online via Zoom. The seminar theme is 'Methodism and Race'. The keynote paper will be the annual Fernley-Hartley Lecture given by Prof Anthony Reddie, with the title: 'Racism and the Methodist Church: Going Beyond a Theology of Good Intentions'. #### MWRC Annual Lecture Online on 22 June 2021

This year's annual lecture will be given by **Thomas A. Noble**, Professor of Theology, Nazarene Theological Seminary and Senior Research Fellow, Nazarene Theological College. The lecture will be on **Tuesday 22 June 2021 at 5pm** UK time (12/noon Eastern time in North America) online via Zoom. Registration is required and can be <u>completed here</u>. The title of the lecture is '**Theology and the Wesleyan Tradition**'. A short video previewing the lecture can be found on the <u>MWRC YouTube Channel</u>. Below is a short abstract of the lecture.

Within the Christian Church some traditions, including the Reformed, Lutheran or Roman Catholic, have produced leading, front-rank theologians. Other traditions, such as the Anglican and Wesleyan traditions, have their theologians, and of course, significant biblical scholars, but Systematic or Dogmatic Theology seems to have played a lesser role. Wesley himself has been regarded as a 'folk theologian' (Outler) or more recently a pastoral theologian. The lecture addresses the role of Christian Theology in the history and mission of the Wesleyan tradition.
