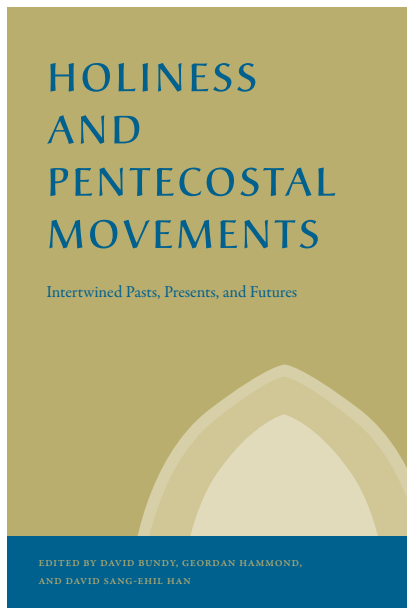

The Holiness and Pentecostal movements have influenced most Christian churches since the 1830s and have been a central force in the global spread of Christianity. The histories and theologies of the Holiness, Pentecostal, Charismatic, and related movements are intertwined. Yet, they are often studied as distinct movements in relative isolation from each other.

Studies in the Holiness and Pentecostal Movements seeks to enhance our understanding of both traditions by examining the two movements, and their complex relationship, through multidisciplinary approaches. Bringing these traditions into critical comparison and dialogue opens up extensive possibilities for scholarly research.
